

1.3 Bachelor of Theology (B. Th.) / Bachelor of Divinity (B. D. - Undergraduate)

The Bachelor of Theology / Bachelor of Divinity degree is the fourth year of studies at the undergraduate level beyond the Diploma in Theology. (The entry level of the B. D. is a minimum of an STPM or equivalent). The programme provides an opportunity for indepth studies, including the writing of 1 major paper (for B. D. candidates only) which demonstrates a thorough grasp of the subject and an appropriate level of theological reflection and analysis. For the Bachelor of Theology, in addition to the requirements set out in the Diploma in Theology, the student must complete another 30 Units (i.e. 27 Units of academic work and 3 Units of Internship) which are distributed as below:

For those pursuing the Bachelor of Divinity programme, in addition to the requirements of the Dip. Th. the student must complete another 30 units (i.e. 24 credits of academic work, 3 units of Intership and 3 units for a major paper in any discipline). The student in this programme is also required to maintain a B grade average in all courses.

A major paper is required for those pursuing the Bachelor of Divinity programme, in either one of the specialized fields: Biblical Studies; Theology (inclusive of Church History and Malaysian Society) and Applied Theology. The required length of the major paper will be around 30 pages. Students are required to submit the topic of their major paper to the ED Faculty for consideration by the end of the second semester of the third year of studies. Thesis Proposal (max. 10 pages) advised by an ED Faculty member must be submitted to the ED Faculty for consideration preferably by the beginning of first semester of the final year of studies.
