

## 1.1 Certificate in Theology (Cert. Th.)

This is a 2-year programme designed to provide the student with a general but rounded and biblically-based understanding of the Christian faith with a basic introduction to practical ministry.

The academic requirements consist of 60 Units (i.e. 57 Units for academic work and 3 Units for Practicum) with the following composition:

<p>Students will be assigned to churches upon discussion with the Director of Practical Ministry and each year of week-end ministry will be taken as 1.5 Units. Students are required to write a monthly report on their week-end ministry and to read an assigned book each semester that focuses on an aspect of practical ministry. Weekend ministry is evaluated on the basis of a report submitted each semester by a supervisor in the church where the student is assigned. Students may also gain 1 Unit for mission trips engaged in once a year. Guidelines are provided for students to write reports on such trips.</p>
